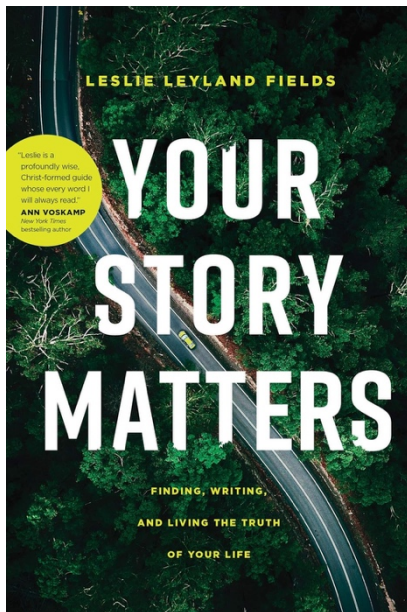




One Story Workshop Books

1. *Your Story Matters* – **Leslie Leyland Fields** ([shopping link](#))

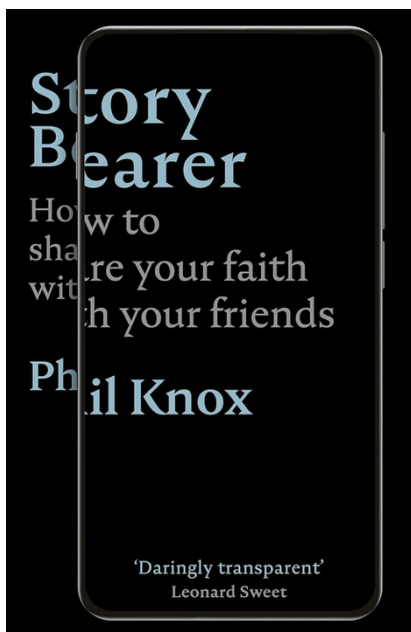

3. Tell Someone – Greg Laurie ([Shopping link](#))

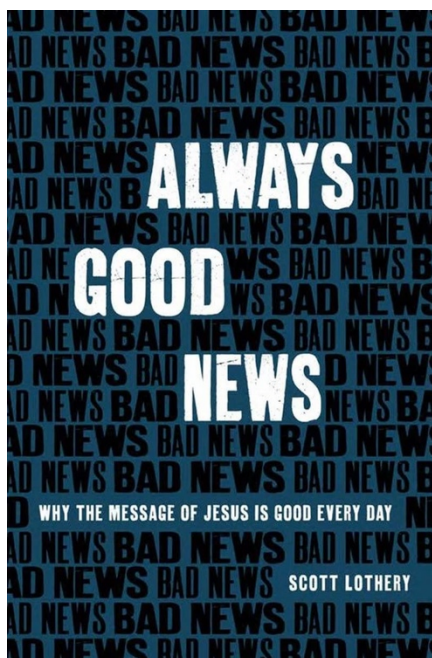

4. Always Good News – Scott Lothery ([shopping link](#))

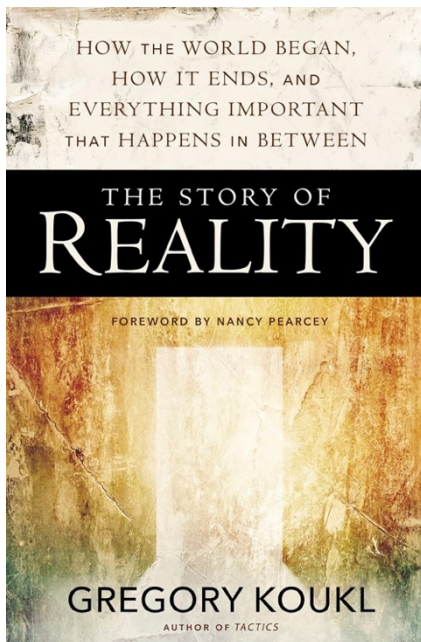

6. Turning Everyday Conversations into Gospel Conversations – Jimmy Scroggins ([shopping link](#))



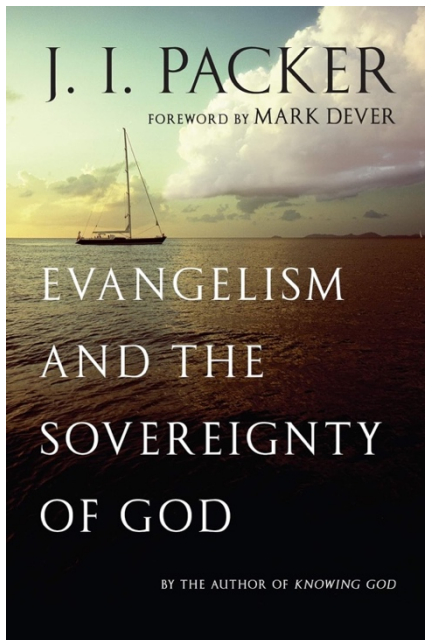
Jimmy Scroggins and his team introduce the “3 Circles” tool—an easy, reproducible method for sharing the Gospel naturally in everyday life.

7. Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God – J.I. Packer ([shopping link](#))

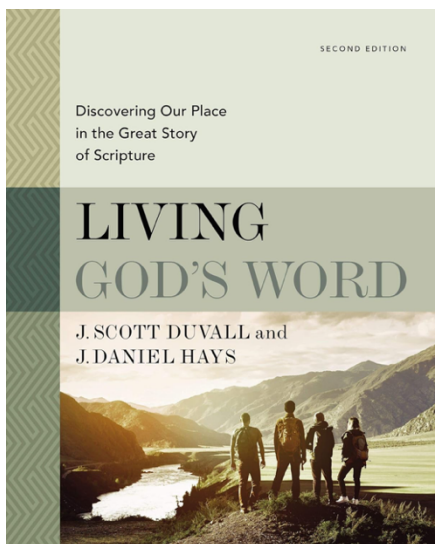

8. Living God's Word – J. Scott Duvall & J. Daniel Hays ([shopping link](#))



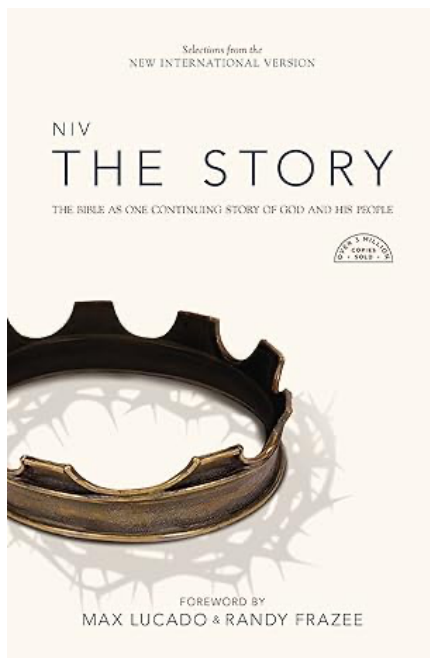
