


One Prayer Workshop Books


1. A Praying Life – Paul Miller (shopping link)

2. Organic Prayer – Kevin Harney (shopping link)



3. The Ministry of Intercession – Andrew Murray (shopping link)



4. Evangelism and the Sovereignty of God – *J.I. Packer* (shopping link)



5. Gentle and Lowly - Dane Ortlund (shopping link)




At its core, *The Valley of Vision* helps readers
