

# One Story Shared Can Make an Eternal Differences.

Can you briefly share your one conversation story at your table?

## What Is “One Story”?

One story is a simple way to share **how Jesus has become “real” in your life.**

**Psalm 66:16 says:**

**“Come and hear...and I will tell you what God has done for my soul.”**

Your story helps others see Jesus!

## Why Stories Matter

- **Stories are memorable**— People forget points, but remember your story.
- **Stories build trust**— Honesty opens the door for honesty.
- **Stories connect emotionally**— “Facts may inform, but stories invite.

The blind man simply said: **“One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see.”** — *John 9:25*

## Part 1: Testimony — Share Your Story

**You don’t need a dramatic story.**

Use the 3 simple framework:

- **Before Christ** — What was missing?
- **Meeting Christ** — What changed?
- **After Christ** — What’s different now?

### Table Discussion #1 (8 min)

**Step 1:** Reflect — Before Christ → Meeting Christ → After Christ

**Step 2:** Write 2–3 sentences for each part

**Step 3:** Share with a partner

## Part 2: Scripture – God’s Word Transforms the Heart

Your personal story reaches the heart.

**God’s Word transforms the heart.**

### Why Scripture Matters

- It shows your hope is based on truth.
- It connects your life to God’s Story.
- It invites people to explore the Bible for themselves.

Five commonly used scriptures for outreach:

- **John 3:16** — God loves you.
- **Romans 6:23** — Sin brings death, but God gives life.
- **Romans 5:8** — Christ died for us.
- **Romans 10:9–10** — Respond in faith.
- **Ephesians 2:8–9** — Grace, not works.

We point them to God’s Word.

Your experience opens the door, but Scripture shows them *who Jesus is* and *what He offers*.

Think of Scripture as the **anchor**. It keeps the focus on God’s truth.

### Table Discussion #2 (8 min)

Write down 3 Scriptures that speak to your “one’s” life right now, and share with your group how you might share them.

## Part 3 – Gospel: Invite Them into God’s Story

The Gospel invites your “one” to respond to what God has done for them.

### What is the Gospel?

“The gospel is not good advice. **It is good news!**”

It’s not about our effort. **It’s about His finished work.**

### Four-point Gospel outline:

- **Lord** — Jesus is God and King.
- **Sin** — We went our own way.
- **Savior** — Jesus rescues us through the cross.
- **Faith** — We respond by trusting Him.

“That’s the Gospel. It is **good news.**”

### Table Discussion #3 (8 min)

Let’s briefly **share God’s story**

- Using the outline **Lord → Sin → Savior → Faith**
- Share the Gospel with someone at your table (60–90 seconds).
- Reflect: *How did it feel to share God’s story simply and clearly?*

## Final Wrap-Up

**Share your story** for the person God puts on your heart.

**Remember:** God opens hearts — we simply share.

*“I planted the seed, Apollos watered it, but God has been making it grow.”— 1 Corinthians 3:6*
